## AMENDMENT TO THE DEFINITION OF FULLY VACCINATED (FV) STATUS TO RETURN WORK AND TO ENTER JP'S PREMISES

Dear All,

- 1. In line with MOH latest advisory, from 14 Feb 2022 onwards, all individuals will have to take a booster shot within 270 days after completing their full course of vaccination (2 doses of mRNA or 3 doses of Sinovac/ Sinopharm vaccines) to retain their FV status.
- 2. This will affect an individual who had completed his/her full course of vaccination on/before 20 May 2021. Failure to do so will mean that the individual will be considered as not vaccinated until the booster shot is done from 14 Feb 2022.
- 3. Those that will not be affected from 14 Feb 2022 onwards are:
  - a) Individuals who had yet to reach the 270 days of expiry from the last date of his/her full course of vaccination. Example will be that if an individual completed his/her full course of vaccination on 1 Dec 2021, he/she will have 270 days from 1 Dec 2021 to take the booster shot.
  - b) Individuals who are medically ineligible for vaccine administration.
  - c) Individuals who had undergone the full course of vaccination (2 doses of mRNA or 3 doses of Sinovac/ Sinopharm vaccines) and had fully recovered from COVID-19.



- 4. For recovered individuals who were unvaccinated or partially vaccinated before their infection, they will need one dose of mRNA or 2 doses of Sinovac/ Sinopharm to retain their fully vaccinated status from 14 Feb 2022. For example, if you had taken 2 doses of Sinovac, and then contracted COVID-19, you would need one more Sinovac or Sinopharm dose post-recovery to qualify as fully vaccinated. You should get your additional dose at least 28 days from the date of your COVID-19 diagnosis.
- 5. Please take note of this latest change in the FV status in order to return to work and enter JP's premises. Thank you.
